- On average, FAITH Scholars maintained a 3.80 GPA and graduated within the top 10% of their class
- Over 92% were inducted into the National Honor Society



- Over 90% of FAITH Scholars led or founded clubs and student associations
- FAITH Scholars are engaged as leaders within their Hellenic American and Greek Orthodox communities



- Each FAITH Scholar averaged over 350 hours of community service in outreach initiatives such as organizing food distribution drives, advocating for eco-friendly practices and assisting underserved populations
